THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 25

USA/Johannesburg

Board your flight today for Johannesburg, South Africa.

FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 26

Arrive Johannesburg, South Africa

Welcome to South Africa! The largest city and the commercial capital of the country, Johannesburg has changed within living memory from a roistering mining camp into a thriving metropolis. It was in 1886 that two penniless prospectors stumbled on an outcrop of The Reef, now the richest gold field in the world. (Nearly 66 million pounds of ore have since been extracted.)



Upon arrival in Johannesburg today, you are met and privately transferred to the hotel.

The Westcliff Estate boasts two heated horizon pools, the most notable being the infinity pool, with a bird's eye view of the Johannesburg Zoological Gardens below. Swim to the edge and gaze down upon elephant and springbok – a singular sensation and what's become known as the safari swim! With magnificent, breathtaking views, the well-equipped gymnasium is also available to all guests for use. A personal trainer can be arranged upon request.

SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 27

Johannesburg / Livingstone, Zambia (Victoria Falls)

After breakfast you are transferred to the airport for your international departure to Livingstone, Zambia. On arrival in Livingstone you are met and transferred to your lodge, arriving in time for a late lunch. Enjoy the afternoon at leisure or begin exploring the area by way of one of the many included activities.



Sussi & Chuma is situated on one of the most beautiful stretches of the Zambezi River. The main lodge consists of a striking two-story lounge and dining area. The second floor bar has an elegant shaded deck with incredible views across the wide, fast-flowing river. Guest accommodations consist of luxury tree houses, built beneath the canopy of majestic ebony trees lining the riverbank. Each suite provides its own private viewing deck.

Late in the afternoon, you take a private sundowner cruise on the Zambezi River. While relaxing, you have the chance to view hippo, elephant and crocodile, as well as the amazing birdlife.

Dinner tonight may be on your own at a private table or as a group.

SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 28

Sussi & Chuma / Victoria Falls / Sussi & Chuma

Without question, the most popular activity while at Sussi & Chuma is a tour of the Victoria Falls, which are the largest in the world. Here the Zambezi River widens to 1688 meters, then it plunges down across the entire width of the deep chasm with a force of 545 million liters of water per minute in rainy season. We will take you to the Zimbabwe side of the falls so that you can have the best impact of the falling water which is so great that clouds of spray rise up to a height of 500 meters and "rain" down again. A lush forest is sustained all around the Falls because of the almost constant showers falling from its spray clouds.

Annual "rainfall" in excess of 32 meters has been recorded, and rainbows are commonly seen by visitors. It is the clouds of spray that have given rise to the African name for the Falls: Mosi oa Tunya ("The smoke that thunders").



The first European to view this great cataract was Dr. David Livingstone. In November of 1855, he traveled downstream by dugout canoe to the very edge of the Falls with African natives as guides. It was from a grassy ledge of present-day Livingstone Island that he first saw the Falls and named them in honor of Queen Victoria. A commemorative statue of Livingstone has been positioned near Devil's Cataract to gaze eastward along the entire line of the Falls.

MONDAY, NOVEMBER 29

Livingstone / Kasane, Botswana / Chobe Chilwero Lodge



After breakfast you are transferred to the airport for your shared charter flight to Kasane Airport in Botswana where you are met for the 10 minute road transfer to the lodge.

The name Chilwero means "place of high view" in the local Setswana language, and true to this name sake, Chobe

Chilwero is positioned high above the Chobe River and offers unparalleled, panoramic views across the islands and floodplains, stretching as far as Namibia.

There is no lodge in the Chobe National Park area that can offer the fantastic comfort, world-class service, and all round game experience that Chobe Chilwero offers its guests. Chobe Chilwero has 15 stone and thatched bungalows. Each bungalow measures 200 square feet and has its own en-suite bathroom with a modern bath, indoor and outdoor showers, private garden with hammock, "sala" or private balcony, mosquito nets, ceiling fans, air-conditioning, hairdryer, minibar as well as an in-room safe.

The main public area includes a lounge and dining room, which are linked to outdoor viewing patios. The wine cellar is temperature



controlled and houses a large variety of the finest South African and European wines.

Your camp manager will brief you on the lodge and the surrounding area prior to your afternoon game viewing activity. One of the most spectacular sites in all of



Africa happens right here each evening at sunset... you will be transferred to the river where you board the lodge boat for a sunset cruise "and show." Often in the hundreds but always in the dozens, you will see elephants make their way to the river as if to join you for a sundowner. Here they pause and drink for several minutes before making the swim across the river,

often passing just a few feet from your boat! It is now, if not before, that you feel you are someplace very special.

As the sunlight fades you return to the shore and are transferred back to camp where you experience fine dining here in the very heart of the African bush.

Chobe Chilwero Lodge B, L, D

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 30

Chobe Chilwero Lodge

This morning you might enjoy a game drive before breakfast or sleep in and enjoy the facilities of the lodge.

The newly opened Spa offers a range of spa and hydrotherapy treatments from both the Thalgo and Africology ranges. The spa features an arch shower, plunge pool, relaxation area, male and female changing rooms with lockers, as well as two treatment rooms.



You might wish to join one of the resident safari guides and head off to explore the northern section of Chobe National Park, an area comprised of flood plains, sandy depressions, and Kalahari-type desert. Famed for its abundant wildlife and profusion of bird life, Chobe delights with its action-packed game drives.

Closer to mid-day, you are likely to spy a variety of thirsty creatures, such as elephant, buffalo, sable, bushbuck, roan, and waterbuck, as they make their way down to the river banks for a drink of water.

Conclude your day back on the river again or in the park; either option topped off by one of Chobe's fiery sunsets makes for some truly unforgettable memories.

WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 1

Chobe Chilwero Lodge / Kasane / Chief's Camp

After breakfast you are met for transfer to the airport for your shared charter flight taking you directly to the Chief's Camp airstrip.

Located in the Mombo area of Botswana's Moremi Game Reserve, on a

private concession just off Chief's Island, this tented camp provides an oasis of comfort in the heart of the lush Okavango Delta. Twelve luxury en suite tents, each with their own private viewing deck allow for a panoramic view of the flood plains teeming with animal activity along the nearby Pajajo Channel.

THURSDAY AND FRIDAY, DECEMBER 2 & 3

Moremi Game reserve

The Mombo area is renowned for its resident large prides of lion and wild dog sightings. You have two full days for game viewing activities. Morning and afternoon game drives are available in four-wheel-drive vehicles, secure hides for enthusiastic game watchers and *mokoro* (dugout canoe) trips along the narrow Delta channels are also offered.

Time between game drives may be spent relaxing during the midday heat. The pool and library offer a cool diversion for those who prefer the public spaces to their own large tents or private verandahs. Enjoy leisurely lunches recounting your sightings with your fellow travelers before you head out for afternoon sundowners and game viewing.

BOOKING CONDITIONS

PAYMENT

In order to reserve the space on this program, Abercrombie & Kent must receive a deposit of \$2,000 per person. The balance of payment is due 90 days prior to departure.

CANCELLATION

When a written cancellation is received by Abercrombie & Kent more than 90 days prior to departure, the deposit will be refunded less a \$1500 per person cancellation fee.

Written cancellations received less than 90 days prior to departure are subject to the following forfeit of tour cost

- 89-60 days, 50% of tour cost
- Within 59 days of departure, 100% of tour cost

INCLUSIONS

ACCOMMODATIONS

As shown in the itinerary, based on double occupancy rooms with private bath or shower.

MEALS AND BEVERAGES

As indicated in the itinerary, on a *table d'hôte* basis; B = Breakfast, L = Lunch, D = Dinner.

In Zambia & Botswana, all drinks with the exception of premium wines, champagne, liqueurs and spirits.

TRANSFERS

On arrival and departure from airports/camps/hotels and return.

BAGGAGE HANDLING

Flights on light aircraft within Zambia limit baggage to a combined weight of no more than 26 lbs. per person (inclusive of handbags and camera equipment). Flights within Botswana have a luggage limit of no more than 33 lbs. per person.

Note: It is possible to store extra luggage at the Johannesburg International Airport. This would be at an additional charge and is not included in your tour price.

BAGGAGE WEIGHT RESTRICTIONS ARE STRICTLY ENFORCED, for reasons of safety as well as the physical capacity of the aircraft. If your luggage is overweight, you will incur considerable extra costs and your bags can be delayed as they may not travel with you. Soft luggage or duffels, not larger than 22x14x9" in size, are required on light aircraft. Large hard-walled cases will not fit in aircraft cargo holds or safari vehicles, and should not be used.

It is highly recommended that you lock your luggage while in Southern Africa. It is also advisable that you do NOT pack valuable items in your checked luggage.

While Abercrombie & Kent will endeavor to protect your property, baggage, personal effects and other possessions are carried at your own risk. Baggage insurance is strongly advised.

Laundry is included at all camps included in your itinerary (Zambia & Botswana).

SIGHTSEEING / GAME VIEWING

All sightseeing/game viewing excursions as detailed in your itinerary. Entrance fees for scheduled sightseeing, National Parks and Game Reserves.

SURFACE TRANSPORTATION

Surface transportation for all transfers and scheduled sightseeing, using the most modern equipment available.

On game drives, open Land Rovers are used to ensure maximum comfort and convenience for game viewing and photography. You will share a vehicle with other lodge and camp guests, unless a private vehicle has been requested and confirmed for the exclusive use of your party.

Of Special Note Regarding Airport Taxes in Zambia:

Travelers are required to pay a departure tax of USD \$25 (price subject to change without notice) prior to boarding their departure flight in Livingstone. If this amount is not included in your air ticket, it must be paid directly by you onsite. As a precaution we suggest that you have this amount in USD\$ at the ready.

Please also note that internal/domestic air flights within Zambia are subject to a tax of USD \$8 (price subject to change without notice) per person, per sector. In some cases you may also be required to pay this amount directly on site.

The services of a professional English-Speaking driver-guide(s) for transfers in Johannesburg will be provided as detailed in your itinerary.

At Game Lodges in Botswana & Zambia, the services of resident camp guides on game drives, as detailed in the itinerary.

TAXES, SERVICE CHARGES

Hotel taxes and service charges imposed for accommodations and services specified in the itinerary.

OTHER
